Summary:

- The COVES Policy Fellowship is a new program that places scientists and engineers in policy offices in Virginia government, industry, or NGOs for 12 weeks. Fellows are selected from applicants at the graduate and postdoctoral level (MS, PhD, Postdoc) at Virginian Universities.
- Fellows will be paired with an experienced mentor and will receive science policy and communication training, networking opportunities, and will participate in VASEM activities.

1) Science Policy Fellowships

- Places scientists and engineers as advisors or analysts in governmental,
 - NGO, or industry offices Provide training, mentoring, and networking to develop skills needed in science policy
- Strengthens connections between academia, government, and industry
- 2) Science Policy Fellowships provide meaningful changes to Host Offices and the benefits extend past the fellowship period.
- California Council on Science and Technology (CCST) Policy Fellowship
- 1st state-level fellowship, established in 2010
- Places 10 PhD scientists/engineers in Legislative Offices for 1 year

A) Most fellows correct technical errors at least monthly
